Crowe endorsed by area State's Attorneys

Edwardsville – Today, Rachelle Aud Crowe, Democratic candidate for the Illinois Senate's 56th district, announced endorsements of the State's Attorneys from Madison, St. Clair and Jersey counties. Portions of the three counties make up the senate district she is running to represent.
